RDAP Happenings

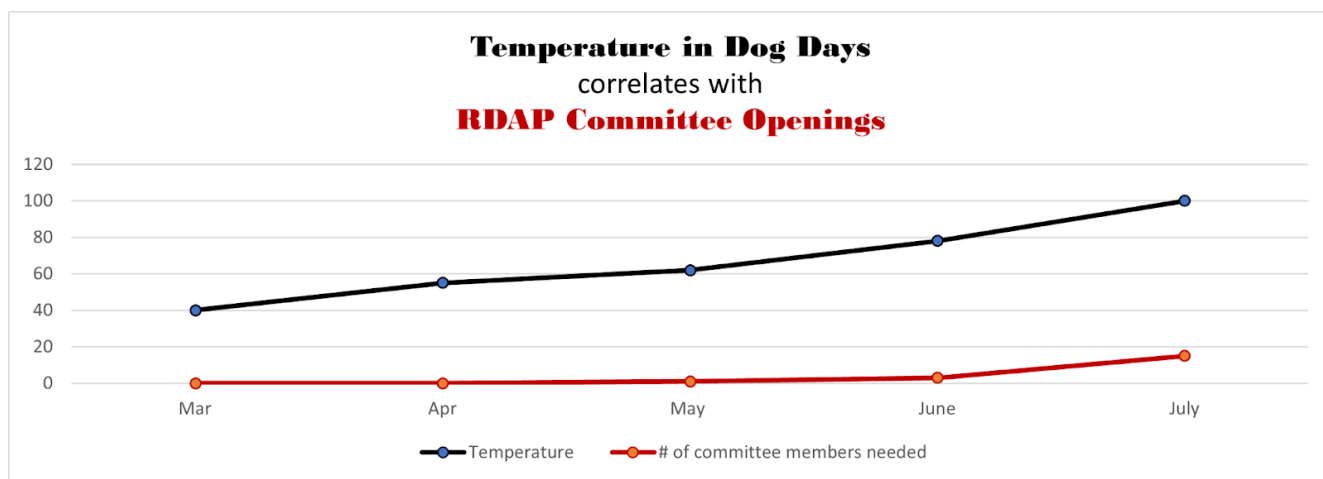
Hi RDAP members,

Submissions should be 1000 words or fewer. Images, figures, and tables are limited to two total, maximum 1500 px wide, and should be placed within the text. Images must be in jpg, jpeg, gif, or png formats. If citing other works, use a numbered, in-text citation style with a reference list at the end.

Language can be informal and submissions should be copy-ready, as newsletter editors provide light copyediting only. Submissions should be uploaded as a Microsoft Word document (.docx) with minimal formatting (headings are allowed where appropriate).

Publishing Committee members serve as editors for this feature as well as all other newsletter content. Questions about the submission process can be sent to

publications@rdapassociation.org. The newsletter is published quarterly in January, April, July, and October. Submissions will be accepted on a rolling basis.

At this time, the newsletter is **not** accepting press releases, marketing materials, advertisements, or product announcements.

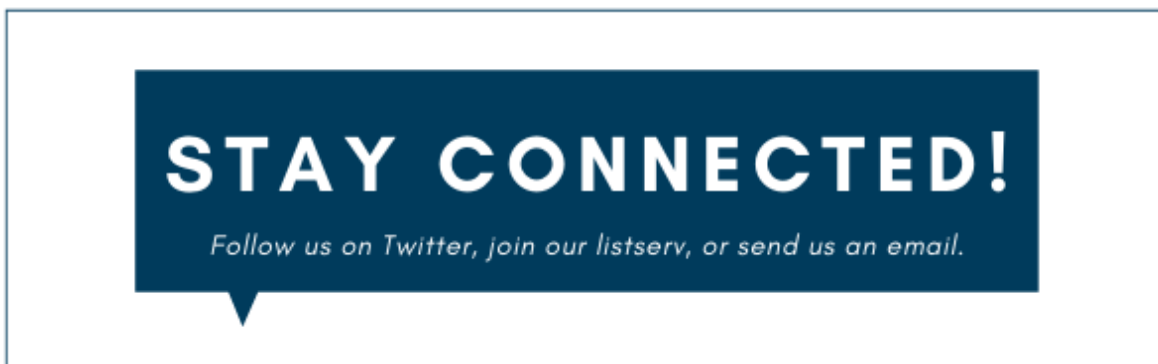
